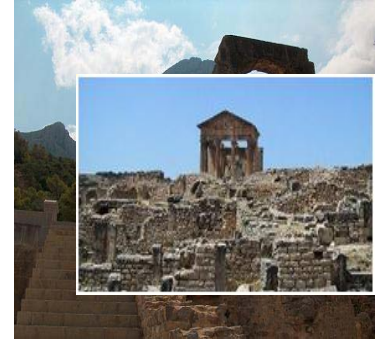




2 Days North of Tunisia: Price= 110 € / person NB: Minimum 6 persons



Day 1: Sousse/Zaghuan/ Dougga/ Tabarka

*Breakfast at the hotel

*Departure for Zaghuan to visit the Water temple of Zaghuan

Water temple: Usually referred by its French name "Temple des Eaux", or "Temple des Nymphes". It dates back to Roman times, and was not a temple, simply a grand fountain. Its location is as impressive today as it must have been in the 2nd century CE. Above it rises the 1,295 meter high Zaghuan Mountain, and in front stretches the fields. You may almost see the Mediterranean Sea on a clear day.

Its decoration has similarities with what you would find in a temple. There are 12 niches each having a life size statue representing the 12 months of a year. In the middle there was really a temple, of which only the central niche remains.

The basin below the platform is shaped like the figure of 8, and served to filter the water before letting it on to the aqueducts. The best remains of the aqueduct are found near

*Road to Dougga

Temple of Celeste, theatres, and the many baths reflect the high standard of living of its 5,000 inhabitants. Declared as UNESCO World Heritage, Dougga has a large capitol, a forum, and triumphal arches honouring Severus Alexander. Underfoot are mosaic floors and superbly paved city streets. In a strange silence, you will still sense the pulse of roman life during the second and third centuries. You can still see the grooves of chariot wheels in the streets and visit the public latrine, a cosy arrangement of twelve seats where people would chat as they went about their business.

Day 2: Tabarka/Biezrte/Utica/Sousse

A Pine and mimosa covered mountain gentle slopes to the sea where bays of fine sand are interspersed with rock "needles", sculpted by the sea. Since antiquity Tabarka has been famous for its coral fishing and the Coral Festival of underwater photography held each summer attracts international visitors and specialists.

The recently built resort Montazah-Tabarka offers a class c yachting harbor with all modern facilities. For the sports minded, an 18 hole golf course stands in a superb 270 acre forest, overhanging the sea and Tabarka has become "the place" for diving, fishing, sailing as well as the ever enjoyable sunbathing.

*Continuation to Utica

Utica is an ancient city northwest of Carthage near the outflow of the Medjerda River into the Mediterranean Sea traditionally considered to be the first colony founded by the Phoenicians in North Africa. Today, Utica no longer exists, and its remains are located not on the coast where it once lay, but further inland because deforestation and agriculture upriver led to massive erosion and the Medjerda River silted over its original mouth.
